Your community's profile tells the story of your community's disaster management efforts, hazard risk, and capacities for mitigating against losses and occurrences. This module of CHAMPS shows the status of your community's efforts toward becoming more resilient.

How will my community benefit from building a profile in CHAMPS?

- Easy access to community points of contact, civic agency, and infrastructure information in one centralized location.
- Track and record hazard occurrence and loss information that is needed to conduct assessments, develop plans, apply for funds, and secure projects to save from future losses.
- Use your profile as a planning tool, to prioritize and keep track of a variety of requirements to be met.

Links

Defined: Public entities inside or outside of your community that you may need to contact or reference for a variety of different purposes.

Examples:	County Judge Executive Office of Emergency Management Mayor's Office Chamber of Commerce Coroner's Office Fire and EMS Property Valuation Administrator Health Department	County Attorney's Office Clerk's Office Roads Department Board of Education Planning and Zoning Police Department Sheriff's Office Area Development District (ADD)
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Civic Agencies

Defined: Community organizations that may have the capacity to provide support before, during, or after a hazard event.

Examples:	Community Food Pantry Red Cross Religious Establishments Local Shelters Senior Citizen Centers National Weather Service Emergency Response Team (CERT)	Kiwanis Club United Way Local Businesses Salvation Army Medical Reserve Corps College/University Utility Provider
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Infrastructure

Defined: Important structures and locations in a community such as critical facilities, utilities, and bridges.

Examples:	Emergency Operations Center (EOC) Firehouse Hospital/Medical Center Water District School/Educational Institution	Power Distribution Station Power Plant Water Treatment Plant Pump Station Bridge
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Standard Requirements

Defined: Regulatory and other local planning initiatives that a community needs to complete in order to become more resilient.

Examples:	Emergency Operations Plan (EOP) Debris Removal Plan Resiliency Assessment Conduct Annual Exercise	Risk Assessment Hazard Mitigation Plan CERT
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Significant Incidents and Events (SIE)

Defined: Records of hazards and threats that affect your community. Incidents are consolidated and analyzed to form your community's risk profile.

Examples:	Flood Winter Storm	Tornado Drought	Severe Storm Wildfire
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
