Course Description:

This two-day course is designed to examine the role, design, and functions of the Emergency Operations Center (EOC) and their relationships as components of a multi-agency coordination system. **Class will begin at 8:30am on both days.**

Course Objectives:

The course provides training about staffing and organization, information, systems, communications and equipment needs at the EOC, activating and deactivating the EOC, EOC operations and EOC testing, training and exercising. Participants will have the opportunity to apply what they have learned during group activities. This course will also focus on the coordination between the Incident Command System (ICS) and the decision making procedures taking place in the Emergency Operations Center (EOC). By taking the time to look at the strengths and weaknesses of these two elements, local officials will have the opportunity to develop an ICS/EOC action plan for their community's local emergency response personnel. An overview of both the ICS and the EOC are presented.

Course Prerequisites:

G 775- Emergency Operations Center (EOC) Management and Operations, ICS 100, ICS 200 (or Unified Command) are highly recommended prior to attending this course.

Student Criteria:

This course is designed for federal, state and local emergency management officials, first responders, incident command staff, private industry and volunteer agency personnel responsible for coordinating activities during a disaster.

Special Notes:

A **MINIMUM** number of **twenty (20)** advance student registrations is **REQUIRED** and must be received by **Thursday, July 19, 2012** in order to conduct this course. You are considered accepted as a student in this class upon receipt of your application by this office so you will not receive a letter acknowledging that acceptance. Meals, lodging, and travel arrangements/expenses are the responsibility of the student and will **NOT** be reimbursed by KYEM.
