Jeff Donaldson, Contributing Associate, Argonne National Laboratory

Jeff Donaldson has worked as a Crisis Communications, Emergency Management and Emergency Public Information specialist for the past 16 years, serving in that role at various sites and organizations throughout the U.S. Department of Energy. He began his DOE career following a nearly

20-plus year career in the newspaper business, where he covered sports, business, crime and education for newspapers from Florida to Washington.

In the DOE, Jeff first served as a public affairs specialist at the Nevada Test Site in Las Vegas. He worked nine years managing the Test Site's Joint Information Center and Emergency Public Information program, recruiting and training, developing technologies and procedures, and helping to implement some of the very first social media-based EPI responses in the complex. He also served there as a Public Information Officer for the Test Site Fire and Rescue Department.

From there, Jeff went to work at Argonne National Laboratory, where he initially spent two years developing crisis communications curriculum, conducting emergency case studies and supporting emergency exercises throughout the country as a member of ANL's mock media teams. Today Jeff still supports Argonne as a contributing associate, and comes to you today in that role.

In 2020, Jeff went to work at Los Alamos National Laboratory and later Sandia National Laboratory, both in New Mexico, supporting the Emergency Management programs there. He helped build strong Emergency Public Information programs, including integrating EPI and crisis communications processes into both DOE and offsite partnerships.

More recently Jeff went to work as an Emergency Management professional at DOE's Legacy Management, based in Colorado. That organization oversees and manages cleanup of legacy nuclear waste sites around the United States. Jeff is a former U.S. Air Force veteran, a father of three grown children, and an author, having published one non-fiction and three-fiction books. He hails from Charleston, South Carolina where he attended the College of Charleston. He currently resides in Las Vegas.
