Webinar Title: The Community Lifelines Status System (CLSS): A New Tool for Post-Disaster Response & Recovery

Description: After a disaster, the stabilization of community lifelines—such as transportation, communications, energy, and water systems, for example—is crucial to save lives and speed response and recovery efforts in an affected area. The new Community Lifelines Status System (CLSS) is a NO COST tool for states and local jurisdictions to that can enhance situational awareness and provide a standardized, near real-time overview of lifeline functionality. This presentation will provide a brief overview of FEMA's community lifelines construct and how the CLSS can be used to better support response and community recovery after a disaster.
