Course Description

The purpose of the new KYEM Form 400, "SEARCH AND RESCUE MISSION NOTIFICATION AND REPORT," is to enable the Division to track all SAR missions with much more accuracy and detail. What we have learned over a number of years, is that the reporting mechanism that we have used is good, but the amount of information critical to tracking missions, is lacking both in detail and consistency of terminology. Very little is provided to determine its usefulness in future missions. By providing accurate details, the Division eventually will be able to produce a "KY Lost Person Behavior" database detailing where a person may be found based on a history of Kentucky SAR missions. This information can only be provided by those agencies who actually perform the missions – you. By compiling all of the details of searches over a long period of time, patterns will be demonstrated in a lost person's behavior. This predictability can and will greatly enhance the planning of SAR missions as well as reduce the search time which could be the difference in life and death to the subject. Class will begin at 8:00a.m. and end at 12:00p.m.

Student Criteria

This course is open to all Emergency Management, Rescue, Fire, Emergency Medical, and Law Enforcement personnel or any organization having responsibility for searching for missing or lost persons. **You MUST be at least 18 years old to register for this class.**

Special Notes

A MINIMUM # twenty (20) advance student registrations is REQUIRED and must be received by **August 31, 2019** in order to conduct this course. You are considered accepted as a student in this class upon receipt of your application by this office so you will not receive a letter acknowledging that acceptance. Meals, lodging, and travel expenses are the responsibility of the student and will *NOT* be reimbursed by KYEM. ***Law Enforcement personnel may receive KLEC credit for completion of this class*.**
